






Established in 1958, Marsiling Primary School has one of the longest history and heritage among schools in the Marsiling / Woodlands estate.


GM Mascots – Ray & Sparkle

Here are some of tips for better home-school partnership.



Embarking on a new adventure

Tip #1: Start a new routine and timetable

- Create a <u>daily schedule</u> that includes blocks of time for different activities such as play, homework and sleep.
- Having <u>sufficient sleep</u> and a <u>good bedtime routine</u> is important in sustaining our children through the school day.
- <u>Talk to our children</u> about getting ready for school, playing with friends and setting time aside for homework.
- Help our children learn how to complete a task before moving on to the next activity.

Tip #2: Have a hearty start each day

• Start the day with <u>a good breakfast</u>. A nutritious meal will ensure our children have the energy to go through their lessons.

 Pack simple and <u>healthy snacks for Take 5!</u> daily to help our children to re-energise and continue their learning through the

school day.

Tip #3: Learn to be independent

- <u>Doing things on their own</u> will help our children learn to take responsibility and be independent.
- Teach them how to do these tasks on their own will help ease them into primary school life.

Get dressed for school and PE lessons

Practise good personal hygiene (e.g., washing their hands, brushing their teeth)

Go to the toilet

Ask for help from teachers, friends, school staff or any adult in the school environment.



Tip #4: Take care of personal belongings

- Start supporting our children in <u>packing their bags</u> for school and remind them to pack only what is needed.
- Guide our children to write their name on their belongings.
- Teach them how to <u>manage their money</u>* so that they can buy food during recess.

* If our children would like to buy something from the bookshop, remind them to ask for permission from you the day before.



Tip #5: Work with the school to help our children adapt

- Connect and communicate with our teachers via Class Dojo, their official email addresses, General Office, or our children' Student Handbooks.
- Respect our teachers' time, contact our teachers during school operating hours.
- Give our teachers time to know and support our children.
- Let the school verify the facts in any incident to ensure a fair,
 objective outcome for all parties.



From 8 Jan (Term 1 Week 2)	7.30 am	1.30 pm

- Students to report to school by 7.30 am on every school day. A student who arrives after 7.30 am is considered late.
- We seek our parents' co-operation to ensure our students attend school daily and punctually.
- Students who are absent from school need to have a medical certificate or other valid official documents.
- Parents are to inform their children's Form Teachers (e.g., via Class Dojo app) if their children are absent on that day.

Dismissal Arrangement

No.	Dismissal Arrangement	Waiting Point
1	Students taking school bus	School Hall
2	Students enrolled in Big Heart Student Care Centre (SCC)	School Hall
3	Students enrolled in Little Bodhi SCC	School Hall
4*	Students going home via the Main Gate	School Hall: Teachers on hall duty will bring students from the hall to Main Gate. Teachers will only dismiss the students to their parents/ registered caregivers at Main Gate.
5*	Students going home via Side Gate 3	Teachers will bring the students from the class to Side Gate 3. Teachers will only dismiss the student to their parents/ registered caregivers at Side Gate 3.
6	Students going home with their sibling(s) studying in MPS	Students will wait for their sibling(s) in the sheltered area near Side Gate 3 before leaving school together.
7	Students taking private transport	Parents can only drive into the school after 2.00 pm. Students to wait for their parents in the roundabout (foyer).

^{*} Parent/caregiver must be present before student is allowed to leave the school. Please be on time and inform the Office/Form Teacher early if you are unable to do so.

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Dismissal Arrangement

On the First Day of School (2 January 2024), please allow our children to go through the actual dismissal process so that they can be independent right from the start of the school year.

To prevent confusion for your child, it is important that parents do not make any change to the venue of his or her pick-up and/or mode of transport. This is so that our children will be able to learn the routine from Day One and not be affected by inconsistency in instructions.



Administrative Matters

- Timetable will be given out by 5 January 2024 (Friday). Please help your child pack the learning materials to bring according to the timetable.
- The current orientation group (1A to 1F) is NOT the class that your child will be in for 2024. The school will share another update once your child's class has been confirmed by the end of January 2024.
- Please ensure that all your child's belongings and learning materials are clearly labelled with his/her name. Due to safety issue, the school discourages our students from carrying trolley bags (see sample picture below) to school.

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
