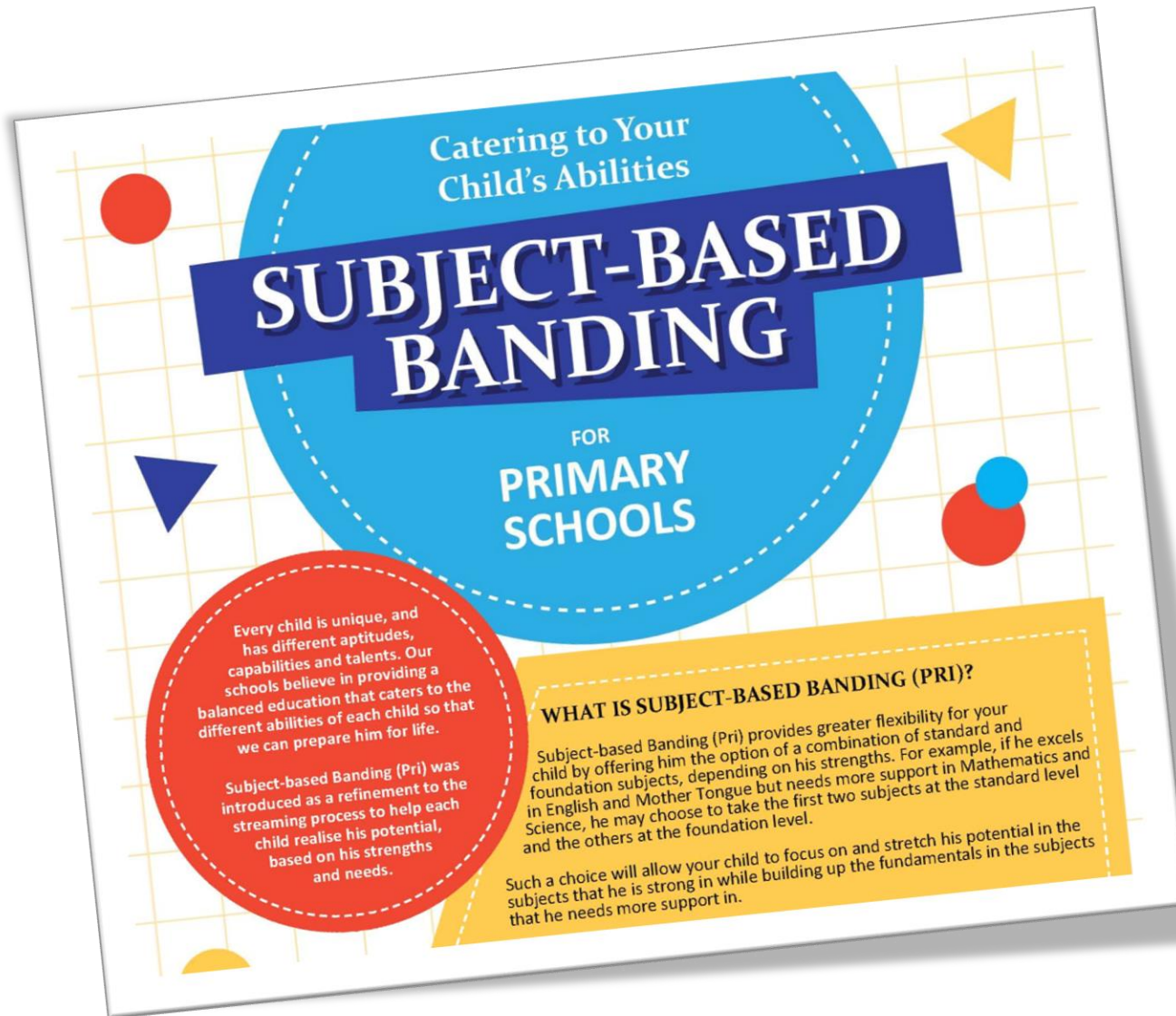

SBB Process



Objectives of SBB

- Every child is encouraged to do the subjects at the level that **best meets his/her abilities**.
- **More flexibility** for students to do subjects they are strong in.



Greater Flexibility

- Students can take a **mix of standard and foundation** subjects through SBB at P5 and P6.
- This would allow your child to:
 - **Stretch their potential** in subjects they are strong in.
 - **Build up their understanding** in subjects they need more help with.

SBB Process

HOW DOES SUBJECT-BASED BANDING (PRI) WORK?

@ PRIMARY 4

Student sits for school-based examinations

School recommends a subject combination based on the student's results.

Parents fill up an option form indicating the preferred combination.

@ PRIMARY 5

Student takes subject combination chosen by parents

English Language, Mathematics, Science and Mother Tongue Language are available at standard and foundation levels.

Higher Mother Tongue Language is also available.

School assesses student's ability to cope with the current subject combination at the end of the year. Adjustments to the number of standard and foundation subjects can be made, if necessary.

@ PRIMARY 6

Student takes subject combination decided by his school and sits for the Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE) at the end of Primary 6.

SBB Process

| If your child (for P4 exam) | Your child may be recommended to take |

| Passes all 4 subjects and performs very well in Mother Tongue Language | 4 standard subjects + Higher Mother Tongue Language |
| Passes all 4 subjects | 4 standard subjects |
| Passes 3 subjects | 4 standard subjects |
| Passes 2 subjects or less | 4 standard subjects; or |
| | 3 standard subjects + 1 other foundation subject; or |
| | 2 standard subjects + 2 other foundation subjects; or |
| | 1 standard subject + 3 other foundation subjects; or |
| | 4 foundation subjects |



SBB Process

- **Fair assessment** of every child
- **Professional inputs** from the SBB Panel
- Focus on **child's strengths**
- **Holistic and balanced** assessment to ensure the child's total well-being
- **Final recommendation** by the school





Subject Combinations at MPS

What are the SBB subject combinations offered by our school?

Subject Combinations at MPS

| Option | Subject Combinations | |
|--------|----------------------|---|
| 1 | 4S1H | English Language, Mother Tongue Language, Mathematics, Science and Higher Mother Tongue Language |
| 2 | 4S | English Language, Mother Tongue Language, Mathematics and Science |
| 3 | 3S1F (FMT) | English Language, Mathematics, Science and Foundation Mother Tongue |
| 4 | 2S2F (FMA & FSC) | English Language, Mother Tongue Language, Foundation Mathematics and Foundation Science |
| 5 | 4F | Foundation English Language, Foundation Mother Tongue Language, Foundation Mathematics and Foundation Science |

Subject Combinations at MPS

Higher Mother Tongue

- Students who are **capable of taking HMT** are identified based on their performance in P4 school-based assessments.
- Parents will be advised if their child is eligible to take HMT.
- **Option is given only once at the end of P4.** Do consider your child's overall strengths and areas of concern before making the option.
- If a child is unable to cope with demands and rigour for certain standard subjects, the school reserves the right to redirect the child to a course which is more appropriately pitched to his/her ability levels and learning styles.
- Subsequent movement (from P5 to P6) will be based solely on your child's performance and the **school's decision.**

Subject Combinations at MPS

Higher Mother Tongue

- Lessons are conducted during curriculum time **+ 1 additional hour after school**
- **2 different examinations** (1 for MT & 1 for HMT)

Subject Combinations at MPS

Using HCL for Admission into SAP Schools

Students who obtained a Distinction/Merit/Pass for HCL at the PSLE and an overall PSLE Score of 14 or better will receive a posting advantage when applying to SAP schools.

Students will be considered for admission to SAP schools in the following order:

| | | | | |
|-----|---|---|-------------|---|
| 1st |  | 7 | NO HCL | Students with better PSLE Scores will be posted first, even if they did not take HCL. |
| 2nd |  | 8 | DISTINCTION | |
| 3rd |  | 8 | MERIT | Amongst students with the same PSLE Score, those with better HCL grades will be posted first. |
| 4th |  | 8 | PASS | |
| 5th |  | 8 | NO HCL | |
| 6th |  | 9 | DISTINCTION | |

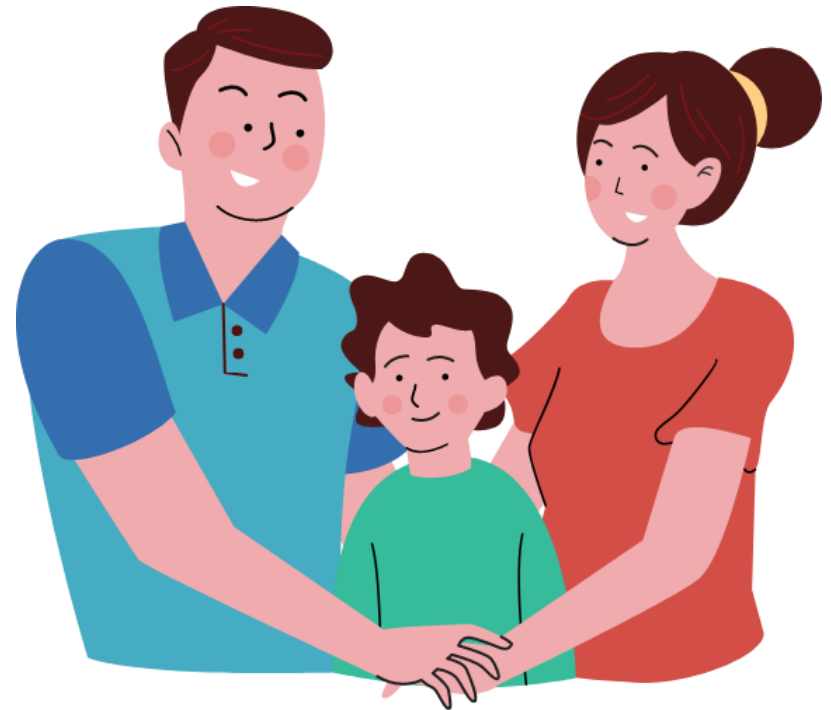


Preparing your child for P4 SBB

Parents' Support

1. Encourage your child

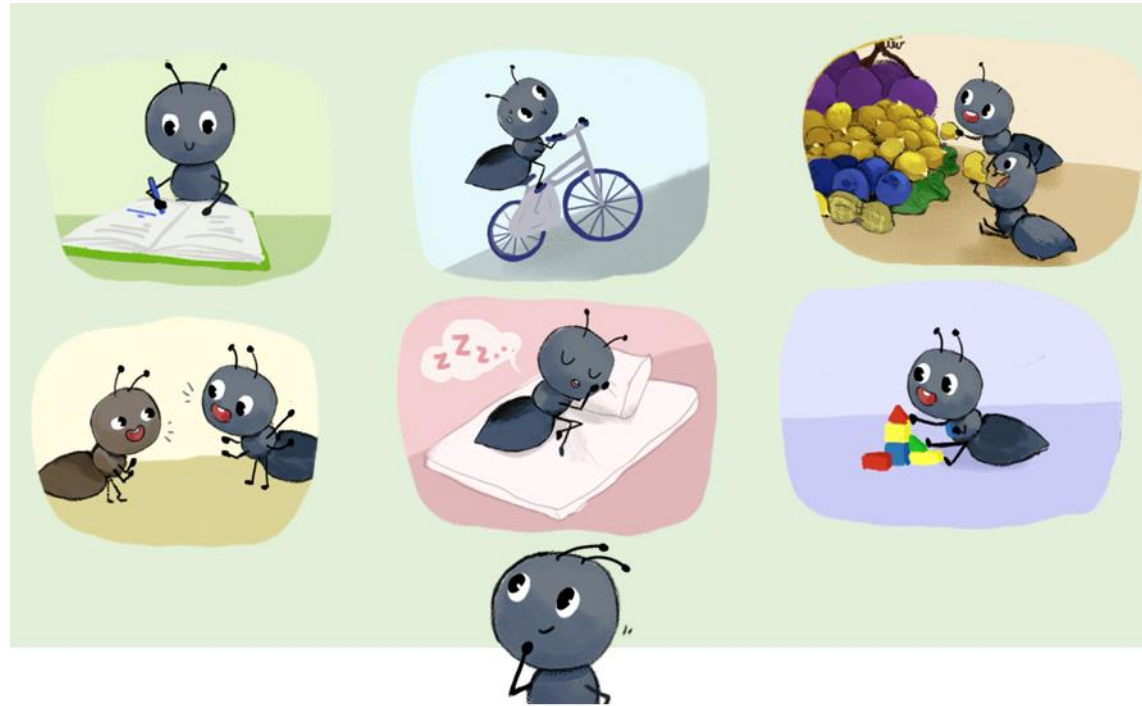
- affirm your child's effort when your child does well
- be there if your child does not do well or is discouraged.



Parents' Support

2. Set routines after school

- Ensure your child has a proper study place.
- Encourage them to complete all homework and revise consistently.



Parents' Support

3. Help your child to build resilience

- Encourage your child to adopt a growth mindset
- Guide them to move towards overcoming the challenge
- Share with your child that challenges are part of life and support them by problem solving **with** them, not for them.



Parents' Support

4. Celebrate little successes

- Effort is important!
- Take every opportunity to remind your child the importance of discovering themselves, lifelong learning and staying positive.

Effort *is* important





Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

FAQ #1

If my child takes HMT and does not do well in WA1 and WA2 in P5, can my child drop HMT after WA2 in P5?

Answer:

No. The school would like the student to **complete the HMT till the end of the year**, before we assess whether the student qualify to do HMT in Primary 6.

FAQ #2

If my child does not do well in his EL, MA and SC subjects in P5, can my child continue with HMT in Primary 6?

Answer:

For a student to continue with HMT in P6, the school will look at the performances of the P5 subjects before making the final decision accordingly.

At P6, the final allocation of subjects will be decided by the school.

If my child does not take up Higher Mother Tongue in Primary School, can my child still take it up in Secondary School?

Answer:

Yes. According to the Eligibility Criteria for Secondary School HMTL, your child needs to attain the following:

(i) An overall PSLE score of 8 or better

Or

(ii) An overall PSLE Score of 9 to 14; and attain

- AL1 /AL2 in MTL or
- Distinction/ Merit in HMTL

Will my child be at a disadvantage if he/she takes the subject combination 4F (all subjects at the foundation level)?

Answer:

Taking subjects at the foundation level is **not** a disadvantage for your child. It will **help them to build up the fundamentals** for the subjects and **better prepare** them for progression to secondary school.

With Full SBB implemented in secondary schools by 2024, we will move towards a **secondary school education where students learn each subject at the level that best caters to their overall strengths, interests and learning needs.**

If my child is offered 2S2F for his/her P5 course, can I opt for him/her to take 4S?

Answer:

Yes. However, you will need to consider the **academic demand** and **well-being of your child**. There must also be strong support and monitoring at the home to help your child manage the rigour of taking a more demanding combination than what is recommended by the SBB panel. Please discuss with the Form Teacher and your child.



Principal's Closing

SUBJECT-BASED BANDING (PRIMARY) OFFERING DIFFERENT SUBJECT COMBINATIONS



Subject-Based Banding (Primary)

- Offers students the option of Standard and Foundation Subjects, depending on their strengths.
- Allow students to focus on and stretch their potential in the subjects they are strong in while building up the fundamentals in the subject they need more support in.
- The new PSLE scoring system will not change the considerations for deciding on a student's subject combination.

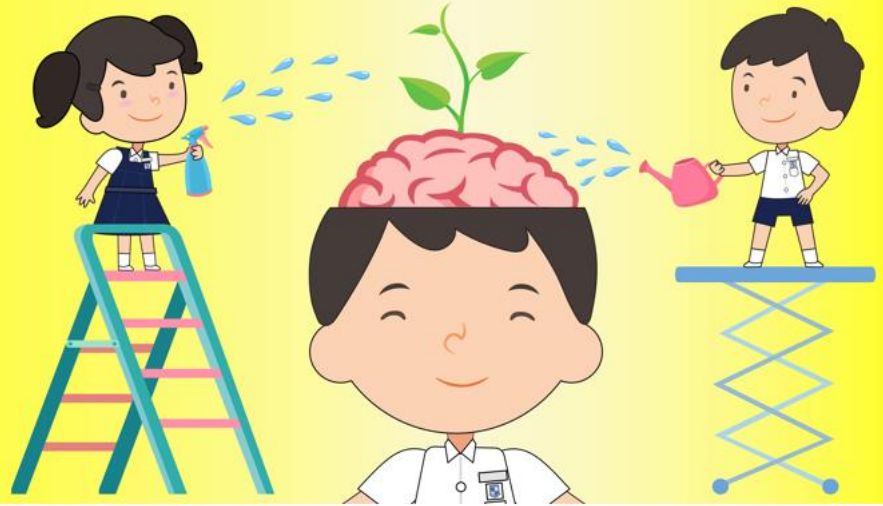
